

Health & Wellness Month March 2024

2024: The Year for Making Self a Priorit



"Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers."

John 1:2

March has been designated as Health & Wellness Month. This month we bring awareness to Heart Disease, the number 1 – Cause of death in men and women, claiming the lives of 700,000 people annually, (29% of all deaths in the United States). Source-Center for Disease Control: It is a result of: high blood pressure, unhealthy cholesterol levels, too much weight in the midsection, obesity and diabetes; smoking and secondhand smoke exposure, physical inactivity. **Dr.**Michelle O'Donoghue, a leading Cardiologist states that women have different symptoms of a heart attack: Chest pressure, Nausea, Sweating, Vomiting, Pain in the neck, jaw, throat, abdomen or back.

A major heart disease affecting adults is **Cardiomyopathy (hATTR)**, a disease of the heart muscle that makes it harder for the heart to pump blood, and causes the heart muscle to become enlarged, thick, or rigid, becoming weaker. The heart is also less able to pump blood throughout the body and incapable of maintaining a normal electrical rhythm, resulting in heart failure or irregular heartbeats called arrhythmias and heart valve problems. The sooner, one can be diagnosed, and tested, appropriate treatments can begin with a prognosis for better outcome; but heart damage before treatment is irreversible.

Lenten Meditation & Prayer - March 4-9, 2024



How Do We Become Better 'Followers of Jesus Christ?'

Jesus knew that there was not time to put his disciples through a Doctor of Divinity program where they could spend many hours over multiple semesters pondering, discussing, and writing possible answers to that question. Instead, He gave them the answer in eight, short, easy to understand phrases, in one short lesson. That lesson in the 5th Chapter of the book of Matthew, verses 3-10, The Beatitudes (Blessings), is just as relevant today as it was then. Jesus, like a professor on the first day of class, told His disciples then, and now, what He and His Father expect of their "followers," and what the rewards will be for meeting those expectations.


I encourage you to take time to read and reflect on those expectations during this Lenten season. Simple and direct, easily understood, but challenging to live, especially in this world. You will find them counter to the culture of today, and often in conflict with our nature and instincts. That is the way that it should be. To meet the expectations that we have been given should require us to stretch, to dig deep, root out, suppress, and replace our way of thinking and living with the way, spirit, and mind of Jesus.

Before departing, Jesus prayed to His father for the "followers" that He left behind: "They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world." (John 17:16 NKJV). When we strive to become like Christ, we too will inherit the Kingdom of God and all that it has to offer.

L. 100-9) which designated the month of March 1987 as "Women's History Month.

In 1995, after Congress passed several resolutions to the 1987 bill, President Bill Clinton declared in the month of March of each year the nation will observe "Women's History Month." During the month the contributions and specific achievements women have made to the United States would be recognized over the course of American history in a variety of fields.


