

December Focus: SHARE Generously

Beloved Mt. Calvary family,

Bring Jesus a Christmas Gift


Beloved Mt. Calvary family,

CELEBRATING THE ADVENT SEASON

November 30 - December 24, 2025

Sunday, December 7, 2025 Always Growing

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. John 1:5 (NIV) This Advent, God invites us to make room to grow. Recently, I started a



vegetable garden. Maybe some of you have done the same. I've loved seeing peppers, tomatoes, and herbs ripen under my care. I water them regularly because growth doesn't happen by accident; it happens through continual nourishment. And spiritually, we are no different. Our hearts require regular tending through prayer, Scripture, and worship so that faith can take root and flourish.

I've also noticed something fascinating: plants grow differently depending on the light. During the day, they stretch toward the sun, capturing its energy and transforming it into nourishment. They lean toward what gives them life. Yet growth also happens at night. In the dark, plants often grow upward, sometimes even faster, because the day's energy is freed for development rather than photosynthesis.

In the same way, our spiritual growth doesn't happen only in the bright, joyful seasons where everything feels clear, and God's presence seems obvious. Yes, we reach toward the light of God's love, and it shapes us. But there is also deep, quiet growth that happens in the dark during seasons of waiting, uncertainty, or stillness. Those are often the moments God strengthens our roots and prepares us for what comes next.

Advent is both light and dark. It is a season of holy waiting, where God invites us to open new space within ourselves, space to be nourished, space to stretch, space to grow in ways we may not yet see.

Like the plants in the garden, we thrive when we turn toward the Light. And we are still growing, even when we cannot see it happening.

Prayer:

Lord, help me make room to grow this, Advent. Teach me to turn toward Your light and trust You in the dark. Nourish my heart with Your presence, stretch my faith in this season of waiting, and help me grow in the ways You have prepared for me.

Amen.
