

From The Pastor's Pen...



Greetings Family!

I hope this letter finds you well and warm. February holds some wonderful celebrations and observances for African Americans

If you are looking for a good excuse to focus on something other than the winter weather, let me remind you this is Black History Month, it is also the Founder's Day Celebration for

the African Methodist Episcopal Church, as members and friends across the globe pay homage to our illustrious founder Bishop Richard Allen and in this month, and the 2024 Lenten Season will begin on February 14.

As AME's, we have a heritage to be proud of and our contributions to the history of these United States are numerous. When Richard Allen and others walked out of St. George's that Sunday morning, we became the first African Americans to lead a non-violent protest. When Allen and others purchased the old blacksmith shop in Philadelphia, we became the first African Americans to own real estate in America. We also were the first African American to publish a newspaper in America. Through the Free African Society, Allen passed on to us notable values such as liberation, justice, self-determination, education, and economic empowerment.

February is also Black History Month. A time of reflecting, rejoicing and recommitment. We reflect on what it means to be an African American, as we stand on the shoulders of those who sacrificed much to pave the way for a better tomorrow. We rejoice in the contributions, integrity, leadership and determination of the activists and organizers in their fight for racial equality. We recommit ourselves afresh and anew to go into the world and show that we are equal, have the same rights, can achieve at the same level, and make lives different.

While this month gives us an opportunity to celebrate, we must return to the words found in the Negro National Anthem last stanza, "God of our weary years, God of our silent tears, Thou who hast brought us thus far on the way, Thou who hast by Thy Might, led us into the light, keep us forever in the path we pray!"

Lenten Season

Guiding Scripture: Luke 9:23 NLT

The Lenten Season is a journey toward the cross alongside Jesus. The season begins with Ash Wednesday which derives its name from the practice of blessing ashes and making them in the shape of a cross on the parishioners' foreheads. Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return."

The Lenten Season invites us to an inward journey to fast pray and reflect on our life by entering into the reality of Jesus' journey toward death. Lent culminates with Holy Week the most sacred week in the history of Christianity as Jesus rides into Jerusalem celebrates the last supper with the disciples and commemorates his crucifixion and burial.

The themes of the Lenten Season are: *meditation prayer fasting study* passion self-examination silence contemplation sacrifice reflection patience discipline obedience and benevolence.

CELEBRATING FOUNDERS DAY...




Each year, the African Methodist Episcopal Church (AMEC) celebrates Founders Day, the day that the AME connectional church was established. The church grew out of the Free African Society (FAS) which Richard Allen, Absalom Jones, and others established in Philadelphia in 1787. When officials at St. George's MEC pulled blacks off their knees while praying, FAS members discovered just

how far American Methodists would go to enforce racial discrimination against African Americans. Hence, these members of St. George's made plans to transform their mutual aid society into an African congregation. Although most wanted to affiliate with the Protestant Episcopal Church, Allen led a small group who resolved to remain Methodists.

In 1794 Bethel AME, located in Pennsylvania, was dedicated with Allen as pastor. To establish Bethel's independence from interfering white Methodists, Allen, a former Delaware slave, successfully sued in the Pennsylvania courts in 1807 and 1815 for the right of his congregation to exist as an independent institution. Because black Methodists in other middle Atlantic communities encountered racism and desired religious autonomy, Allen called them to meet in Philadelphia to form a new Wesleyan denomination, the AME.

Today, the AMEC has membership in twenty Episcopal Districts in 39 countries on five continents. The work of the Church is administered by twenty-one active bishops, and nine General Officers who manage the departments of the Church.





This month we celebrate Black History Month, also known as African-American History Month, in the United States. It began as a way to remember

important people and events in the history of the African diaspora.

Black History Facts: Notable Firsts...

• **Bishop Richard Allen** established the first AME Church (Mother Bethel) in Philadelphia, PA in 1787. It is the first independent black denomination in the US. Bishop Allen also became the first elected Bishop of the AME church.

- **Bessie Coleman** became the first African American female pilot and the first to have an international aviation license in 1921.
- Nat King Cole was the first African American to host a network television program. In 1956 *The Nat King Cole Show* aired on NBC.
- Jackie Robinson was the first African American to win the Major League Baseball's Most Valuable Player award in 1949 and the first African American player to be inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1962.
- **Sir Sydney Poitier** is the first African American winner of the Academy Award for Best Actor in 1963 for his role as Homer Smith in *Lilies of the Field*.
- **Thurgood Marshall** was the first African American US Supreme Court Justice (1967).
- **Shirley Chisholm** was the first African American woman elected to the US Congress in 1968 and also became the first African American candidate to run for the Democratic Party's presidential nomination in 1972.
- **Oprah Winfrey** is the first African American woman to host a television show (1986) and the first African American woman to become a billionaire.
- Mae Carol Jemison was the first African American female astronaut in 1992.
- Gwen Ifill became the first African American woman to host a prominent
 political talk show on national television when she became moderator and
 managing editor of PBS's Washington Week and senior political correspondence
 for the PBS Hour (1999).
- **Gen. Colin Powell** is the first African American to become US Secretary of State (2001-2004).
- Condoleezza Rice is the first woman to be the National Security Advisor in the George W. Bush administration (2001-2009) and the first African American woman to be U.S. Secretary of State.
- Barack Hussein Obama is the first African American to hold the office of President of the United States. He was the 44th President (2008-2016). Michelle Obama was the first African American First Lady.
- **Kamala D. Harris** is the first female and African/Asian American to serve as vice president of the United States (2020).

MOUNT CALVARY AME CHURCH YEAR END REVIEW 2023

Ministry continued at Mt. Calvary as we engaged in in-person & virtual Sunday Worship Services, Sunday School, weekly Bible Study, Youth Church, church celebrations, annual days, auxiliary meetings and events, church and quarterly conferences, Harvest Meals, and food pantry distributions. A few highlights of the year includes:

- Thirty One new members, including several families, joined our church this year, eleven members completed New Members' classes and was read into full membership, and three (3) infants, two (2) children, and two (2) adults were baptized. Sadly, four of our beloved members went home to be with the Lord.
- We continued to receive weekly letters from our Pastor Bob this year encouraging us to stay in God's grip.
- We celebrated our Pastor Bob's 6th Anniversary on July 31st. Our theme for this
 wonderful milestone for our pastor was "Connecting the Body of Christ to God
 and Each Other through Loving Liberating Pastoral Leadership." The scripture
 reference was taken from Hebrews 10:25 (NLT). Our very own Rev. Johnny
 Palmer was the guest preacher for the hour.
- The **Steward Board** supported the church this year by leading the congregation in celebrating several special occasions including welcoming Pastor Bob and the first family back after Annual Conference, celebrating Pastor Bob's 6th Pastoral Anniversary at Mt. Calvary, and co-hosting with the Trustees our annual Churchwide Fellowship, 134th Church Anniversary, as well as the 26th Sanctuary Anniversary and 11th Family Life Center Anniversary, hosting the Baltimore District Conference of the 2nd Episcopal District. The Board also continue to lead the Mortgage Liquidation Campaign.
- The Trustee Board and Steward Board worked together to develop and execute the 347 Eudowood Lane Land Purchase Campaign.
- The **Beads** of **Wisdom Ministry** celebrated Beads Annual Day which featured the Beads Choir. The day also included a Memorial Service to remember and honor deceased members. The day culminating with the ministry presenting a check in the amount of \$14,769 to Pastor Bob and the Church to cover a monthly Mortgage Payment. The Beads also hosted a No Senior Eat Alone Day in Baltimore County. Sixty Seniors attended and enjoyed fun, food and fellowship. They also hosted 80 participates at an Informative Session on Funeral Planning (Rev. Johnnie Palmer, Lincoln Heritage), Medicare and Medicaid benefits (Sis. Jijuwania Turner), and Overview on Wills (Sis. Vivian Fenton.
- The Christian Education Ministry provided our monthly scripture and theme; organized and let the 6am Prayer Line; Adult and Children Sunday School and New Members classes.
- The **Congregational Care Unit** hosted an All Members Meet and Greet and an All Members Christmas Celebration. The Unit also engaged in their annual

Calvary seniors and 50 participants who attended the Harvest Meals for the Hungry Ministry 2023 Christmas Dinner in December. met monthly via Zoom, provided monthly and quarterly reports, contacted members, sent cards to bereaved families, produced the monthly Messenger,

- In 2023 the Crafty Hands Ministry continued to use our hand skills to bless the community. Crochet Kleenex box covers, shoulder wraps, walker/wheelchair bags, blankets and clay trinket trays & covered ink pens were given to a local church ministry. The current crafts being utilized are knitting, crochet, polymer clay work and macrame/kumihimo. The ongoing goal of the ministry is to bless the community by using our hands. Crafty Hands will be adding new crafts in the upcoming months.
- The Digital Arts Ministry filmed, produced, and streamed weekly Sunday morning Worship Services, Bible Study, and church events on Facebook and YouTube. In addition, produced all ads, managed the church's social media pages and website, designed graphics for ministries, and sent out email blasts messages.
- The Emma Jane Gardner Missionary Society has so much to be thankful. The ministry receive food donations from the Maryland Food Bank and donations from members, friends and the Assistance Center of Towson Churches (ACTC). They also collected can goods to prepared Thanksgiving baskets to families in need.
- The Harvest Meals for the Hungry Ministry & Culinary Ministries touched lives of seniors and homeless individuals in Towson by serving 919 hot meals in 2023. The ministry hosted Thanksgiving dinner on November 14th and Christmas dinner on the December 19th. To God be all the Glory!
- The **Health and Wellness Ministry** held two (2) successful Blood Drives in partnership with the American Red Cross this year. The ministry also held Surviving the Wilderness Breast Cancer Awareness Luncheon in October. The proceeds of the luncheon helped to raise awareness for breast cancer and celebrate cancer survivors. In addition, the ministry held a Coat Drive in support of the homeless.
- The **Men's Ministry** Saturday Soup Kitchen served 270 hot meals to disadvantages families in Baltimore County and Baltimore City.
- The **Prayer and Spiritual Formation Ministry** held a Walking through Grief and Loss and Connecting in the Care Encounter workshop this year. The ministry also produced the 2023 Meditation and Prayer Lenten Guide.
- The Young People's Department participated in several connectional church events; participated in Vacation Bible School; 2023 Graduation Celebration, the Back-2-School Backpack Give-Away, led Fab Fridays, the Fall Festival Trunk or Treat, and a Christmas Family Pajama Party.
